

## MCom Taxation (Coursework)

#### Programme code

07250185

The content of the coursework modules (BEL 875, BEL 876, BEL 877) will consist of formal lectures, assignments and an examination. The examination for all modules will contribute 50% towards the final mark of a module. There will be no supplementary examinations for any of the modules. The technical reports module (BEL 878) will comprise a minimum of two technical reports. All the required reports must be submitted and will count towards the final mark of the module. Each technical report will carry a subminimum of 40% and on average a student will require 50% for successful completion of the module. Candidates must first enrol for the research methodology module (BEL 893) and obtain a pass mark, before being allowed to enrol for the Mini-dissertation module (BEL 897). The research methodology module (BEL 893) does not carry any credits. The duration of the degree is one year, with a minimum completion time of one year, and the maximum time of two years. A student will not be allowed to register more than twice for the same module.
