Bachelor's degree in Speech-Language Pathology (NQF level 8) or BAHons Augmentative and Alternative Communication degree or relevant honours degree, provided that sufficient background in severe communication disability and research is evident, in which case an admissions examination may be required A weighted average of at least 65% at final-year level At least 65% for the research component at honours level
